

HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT FAST-TRACK PATHWAY





The Bachelor of Business (BBus) is a contemporary programme of study for students who wish to pursue a career in business across a diverse range of industries and in one or more of the following disciplines: ACCOUNTING, MARKETING, FACILITIES MANAGEMENT, PROCUREMENT AND SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT, TOURISM AND HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT, and HEALTHCARE MANAGEMENT. The degree is designed to enable students to become problem-solving professionals who can adapt to a fast-changing world and make a meaningful contribution to society, locally and internationally.

The Bachelor of Business consists of **360 credits**, of which a minimum of **75 credits** at **level 7** is required. Study pathways are available, with a suite of courses recommended for each pathway.



BUSINESS FAST-TRACK PATHWAY

The Graduate Diploma in Business (GDBus) is designed for graduates of a bachelor's degree or similar qualification in a discipline other than business who wish to achieve a level of competency and an advanced qualification in business. It also caters for those with a bachelor's degree in one area of business who wish to broaden their knowledge in another. Some students may wish to use this qualification as a pathway to postgraduate study in business or related disciplines. Others may wish to use it to enhance an existing qualification for a management career in business.

THE GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN BUSINESS CONSISTS OF: Compulsory course:

BUSS611 Organisational Decision-Making Skills

SELECTONEOFTHEFOLLOWING:

BUSS711 Contemporary Organisational Improvement **OR**BUSS723 Internship (15 hours a week, over not more than 28 weeks)

Elective courses

Choose a minimum of 30 credits from Business or Information Technology Level 7 courses

AND

Choose a 15-credit elective course from Business or Information Technology Level 5, 6 or 7 courses

Note: Students who have not completed previous qualifications in New Zealand must select **BUSS511 Culture and Business in Aotearoa New Zealand**.

CROSS-CREDITS are NOT available in the GDBus. Students with prior studies in a subject will be given the opportunity to broaden their knowledge base by taking other courses at the appropriate level.
