

# TEACHING AND LEARNING AT UP INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE NEW ZEALAND

At UP International College New Zealand, we are focused on equipping students with the knowledge and skills required to be successful at university and beyond.

## TEACHING STAFF

Our teaching staff bring a wide range of relevant skills and experiences. Some come from high school teaching, others from university settings, and many from professional industries. A significant number have also taught overseas in international colleges. Around 25% of our teachers hold PhDs, with many of these earned at New Zealand universities.

This diversity of backgrounds provides our students with access to a wealth of knowledge, expertise, and real-world perspectives—helping them to succeed both academically and in life.



## FLEXIBLE LEARNING ACTIVITIES

Many of our courses include Flexible Learning Activities (FLAs)—interactive videos, quizzes, readings, vocabulary practice, and more—that students complete outside of class to build their English, subject knowledge, and skills. Teachers use data from these activities to better understand class and individual progress.

Because FLAs mirror what students encounter in their first year of university, they also develop key skills such as time management, self-motivation, academic independence, and effective study habits.

## LIVE LESSONS

Live Lessons take many forms—lectures, tutorials, labs, and workshops—giving students different ways to build knowledge and skills. Attendance is recorded at every session, as active participation is a key factor in student success. We have clear requirements and follow-up processes to ensure students attend and make the most of these opportunities.

## ASSESSMENT

Our courses are assessed through internal assessments (usually 50%) and final examinations (usually 50%). The internal assessments are made up of different modes of assessments, including tests, presentations, group work, and FLAs. This means that students get many opportunities, spread out over their programme, to show their learning.

# FOUNDATION STUDIES

## WHO IS THIS PROGRAMME FOR?

- New Zealand secondary school Year 12 (NCEA Level 2), or
- Grade 11/12 (Asia), or
- Second/third year of senior high school, or equivalent.

For students who do not meet the requirements above, there is a Foundation Connect option.

## TO ENTER AN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME:

- Successfully complete 120 credits in the Foundation Studies Programme
- Achieve a minimum of 55% in English I, 60% in English IIA, 65% in English IIB and 50% in two other core subjects, equal to 60 credits
- Achieve 50% or higher in six elective subjects equal to 60 credits (300 marks out of a possible 600)

## SUBJECTS

  - English (I, IIA, IIB - 40 credits)
  - Introductory Mathematics (10 credits)
  - New Zealand Culture and Society (10 credits)
- **Elective (10 Credits each)**
  - **Mathematics:** Algebra, Statistics
  - **Sciences:** Biology, Physics
  - **Arts:** Media Studies, Design & Society, History
  - **Commerce:** Tourism, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Marketing, Management Studies

Availability of subjects might change each term.

## ASSESSMENTS

We prepare students for assessments that will get them into the Victoria University of Wellington's degree programmes. Our assessments are benchmarked against international standards and are a stepping stone to achievement.

All assessments are internally assessed. The final mark for subjects is made up of a combination of tests, assignments, projects and presentations.





To gain entry to a Victoria University of Wellington undergraduate degree from the foundation studies programme, you will need to:

- Achieve a minimum of 55% in English I, 60% in English IIA, 65% in English IIB and 50% in two other core subjects.
- Achieve 50% or better in a minimum of six optional academic subjects.

# FOUNDATION CONNECT

Delivered by UP Education, Foundation Connect provides a comprehensive, English-rich curriculum to prepare students for the Foundation Studies Programme (Level 3). This six-month extension programme allows students to develop their English skills, confidence and apply these English skills in an academic setting. Foundation Connect includes engagement in Mathematics and academic courses to give students a broader foundation for future learning.

The programme is marketed as Foundation Connect and the programme name is registered as 'Intensive General English Course' at NZQA.

## COURSE STRUCTURE

There are two core subjects (English and English for Mathematics) and two academic subjects per term. These academic subjects will be used to prepare students for their future academic studies and contextualise their academic English usage.

- English: 11 hours per week
- English for Mathematics: 3 hours per week and 1 Flexible Learning Activity (FLA)
- Academic subjects: 3 live lessons and 1 FLA; students do four academic subjects with two in the first term and two in the second term

The academic subjects available are usually: Business; Science; Humanities (Geography) and Media.

Each term:

- English: 9 live lessons per week
- Maths: 3 live lessons and 1 FLA per week
- 2 Academic subjects: 3 live lessons and 1 FLA

## ASSESSMENTS

Foundation Connect will have a combination of internal assessments and exams with a minimum of 40% of the assessment weightings being exams.

## PROGRESSION REQUIREMENTS

To accept your conditional offer for the Victoria University of Wellington Foundation Studies Programme, you must meet the minimum progression requirement of a 50% pass in all subjects.

### Some important notes:

In exceptional cases, students with outstanding work ethic and academic results may be considered for a fast-track program, subject to academic staff discretion.

If a student needs to re-sit subjects to meet progression grades, an individual study plan will be provided by the academic team. A student failing a Foundation Connect course more than twice cannot re-enroll.

## VISAS AND OFFERS

Foundation Connect students apply for their visa through UP International College New Zealand. Upon completion, they receive a firm offer for the Standard-length Foundation Studies Programme from the Victoria University of Wellington, with a visa issued by the university.

Students can also opt for a pathway visa covering all 3 courses:

- Foundation Connect
- The Victoria University of Wellington Foundation Studies Programme
- Victoria University of Wellington degree

# PATHWAYS LINK PROGRAMME

This programme aims to equip you with essential foundational knowledge, skills, and the confidence necessary to excel in your future Foundation studies. The accelerated one-year programme will offer successful students entry into the Victoria University of Wellington Foundation Studies programmes. PLP is an innovative educational initiative designed specifically for international students aged 14-17 who have recently finished their junior high school education and aspire to study abroad.

Pathways Link is registered as 'Pathways Link - L1A and L1B (Level 1) (Training Scheme)' at NZQA.

## COURSE STRUCTURE

The Pathways Link Programme (PLP) supports younger international students with a nurturing environment and a broad curriculum to build English skills, prepare for Foundation Studies, and explore future degree options.

### Example subjects studied are:

- PLP1A: English, Maths, Biology, Economics, Global Studies
- PLP1B: English, Maths, Physics, Business, Media Studies

### MEDICAL AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021 requires all international students studying in New Zealand to have appropriate health and travel insurance during their period of study.

Allianz Partners is our preferred insurance provider. Enrolled international students will be charged Allianz's Studentsafe Inbound University insurance premium when enrolment is completed. You must pay this fee unless the University approves the use of an alternative insurance provider.

You must have approved insurance for the duration of your study and covering the duration of your visa or until you depart New Zealand, whichever comes first.

Note: Your Victoria University of Wellington student ID number is also your insurance policy number. You are not automatically covered for pre-existing medical conditions. However, any new medical condition that develops after your studies have commenced at UP will be considered a new condition and will be covered.

## SETTLING IN

### ORIENTATION

Orientation Week is the perfect introduction to your studies at our college. It's a great opportunity to meet fellow students, connect with the College Principal and staff, and get familiar with your new learning environment. You'll also finalise your subject selection during orientation.



## ACCOMMODATION

### 🏠 HOMESTAY

Available to all students, homestay is a great way of experiencing New Zealand culture and practising your English every day. You will have your own room with a bed, desk, lamp and wifi, and all meals are included for the full-board homestay option. Laundry is also included.

- All homestays are thoroughly checked—the family is interviewed and the home inspected.
- All homestay providers sign a contract agreeing to rules and standards and undergo a vetting procedure by New Zealand Police.
- All students under 18 are visited in their accommodation quarterly by authorised accommodation assessors.
- All payments to the homestay provider are made via the UP Education Student Fees Trust.
- A 24-hour call centre number is provided in cases of emergency.



The UP English Language Test (UPELT) has been developed to provide prospective students with an opportunity to quickly obtain an English language score prior to enrolment into a programme of their choice.

The test is facilitated online by highly qualified and experienced staff. It consists of computer-based, hand-written, and examiner-led tasks. Test description and instructions for test preparation are made available to all prospective candidates in advance, and a practice test is provided. Measures are taken to ensure the integrity of the test.
